(Additional Class over Co-op petition is recommended to be submitted to the Registrar for APRC approval, during pre-registration before the end of 10th week prior quarter.)</i>

**Room & Time Listed** - class will meet in person only in that room, day and time. No on-line option.

**Synchronous Option** - student's choice, class will meet in person, but will also be live streamed; student has a choice of in person or on-line attendance.

**Synchronous On-line** - class will meet in real time on-line, live streamed. No in person option.

**Asynchronous On-line** - non traditional, student does not attend a set class time, but rather access curriculum materials through CANVAS, email, discussion boards and collaborative documents. No in person or synchronous on-line option.
